

Since the program's inception in 2021, Toccoa Falls College undergoes an annual review to confirm that the M.A in Marriage & Family Therapy program meets the educational degree completion requirements for licensure as a Marriage & Family Therapist (LMFT) in most states. Please note that state boards are frequently changing and clarifying their requirements, so it is strongly encouraged that students determine any additional requirements (e.g. exams, clinical and supervision hours) for licensure in the state in which they seek to be licensed.

Toccoa Falls College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) and the MAMFT program is designed to be accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education (COAMFTE) according to their timelines and standards. Students should refer to their state licensing bodies, as well as the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy and COAMFTE websites for the most current requirements for licensure. For students desiring to pursue licensure as a licensed professional counselor (LPC), please refer to the American Counseling Association or the American Association of State Counseling Boards.
