ONLINE COURSES

Courses are offered during accelerated 8-week sessions (designated as Session A and Session B) and/or during a traditionally paced 16-week session. The same content is covered at varying paces, and the same number of credit hours are earned for the completion of a dual enrollment course in any offered format.

GAFUTURES FUNDING LIMITATIONS *(adapted from GAFutures.org)*

11th - 12th graders* who are Georgia residents and US citizens or eligible noncitizens, enrolled in and approved by an eligible public, private, or homestudy program in Georgia, may participate in the GAFutures Dual Enrollment Program. The Dual Enrollment Funding Cap is 30 semester hours across all postsecondary institutions, and students may not exceed 15 hours within a given semester. Students must meet federal citizenship and Selective Service registration requirements, per Georgia state law. A repeat/retake of a course is not eligible for funding, and a student is no longer eligible to continue to receive program funding after withdrawing from Dual Enrollment course(s) two (2) times.

**10th graders may access GAFutures funding eligibility early with a 1200 on the SAT or a 26 on the ACT*

TEXTBOOKS

All dual enrolled students will receive any required textbooks at no cost; if you prefer a different format than what is provided, you must purchase an additional copy of the textbook yourself. Textbooks will be ordered during the week prior to the first day of class; additional information will be provided at that time. During the add/drop period, students may only add courses with open source textbooks. If you request a course with a required textbook, the dual enrollment coordinators will work with you to determine a suitable alternative option.

PREREQUISITES

Courses with prerequisites - requiring the completion of a previous course or its equivalent - are specified with an asterisk (*). Students who register for courses with required prerequisites not taken through Toccoa Falls must appeal or submit transcripts, test scores, or other proof of completion prior to the first day of class.
